## NCBA President Jerry Bohn

Jerry Bohn is a farmer and cattle feeder from Pratt, Kan. Bohn is part owner of Pratt Feeders, an operation he helped manage for more than three decades. Now retired from day-to-day management of the operation, he serves as a member of the company's board of directors and manages the company's farming business while feeding cattle in his own yards. He has served on the board of U.S. Premium Beef for nine years, and formerly worked for CattleFax.

Bohn has served on numerous industry committees and councils at both the state and national levels. He was president of Kansas Livestock Association, on the Executive Committee of NCBA and served as a board member of the Cattlemen's Beef Board. Bohn has also held leadership positions in numerous local organizations, including president of the Pratt Area Chamber of Commerce and a deacon of the First Southern Baptist

Church. He is a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the Kansas Army National Guard and U.S. Army Reserve.

## Regenerative Rancher Greg Judy

Greg and Jan Judy of Clark, Missouri, run a grazing operation on 1660 acres of leased and owned land. Greg and Jan went from near bankruptcy in 1999 to paying off a 200-acre farm and house in 3 years with custom grazing on leased land and are debt free. They own 4 farms and lease 13 farms. They graze South Poll cattle and St Croix hair sheep.

Greg wrote a book in 2001, entitled "No Risk Ranching, Custom Grazing on Leased Land", which details the methods they used to build their operation from scratch. In 2008 Greg wrote a second book "Comeback Farms, Rejuvenating Soils, Pastures and Profits with Livestock Grazing Management".

Greg's second book covers all the methods they use with Holistic High-Density Grazing, multi-species grazing, grass finishing animals, eliminating costly inputs. In 2021 Greg wrote his 3rd book entitled, "Greg Judy's How to Think Like a Grazier". Greg started his own YouTube channel "Greg Judy Regenerative Rancher" in 2019 and now has 500,000 viewers per month.



Greg gives talks and schools all over the US, Germany, England, New Zealand & Canada teaching the benefits of planned grazing, leasing land, multi-species grazing, custom grazing, agroforestry, and wildlife management. The Judy's hold an annual grazing school at their farm teaching the principles of planned grazing. Greg quit his off-farm job in 2009 and is now a full-time rancher. ## **NEW REPRODUCTIVE TECHNOLOGY**



**Assistant Extension Professor** 

#### Dr. Jordan Thomas

Jordan Thomas is an Assistant Professor and State Beef Reproduction Specialist in the Division of Animal Sciences at the University of Missouri. Dr. Thomas is a Missouri native and University of Missouri alumnus, having earned his Ph.D. in Animal Sciences with an emphasis in Reproductive Physiology in 2017. Dr. Thomas maintains an active applied research program in reproductive management of beef cattle, coordinates the breeding program for cattle across the University of Missouri Agricultural Experiment Station, and serves as program advisor to the Show-Me-Select Replacement Heifer Program. The primary research focus of the Thomas lab is control of the bovine estrous cycle, specifically to facilitate use of reproductive technologies such as timed artificial insemination and embryo transfer.

Kirk R Gray, DVM, MS, is a staff Veterinarian at Cross Country Genetics North, Inc. living in Manhattan, Kansas.
