Hamilton County Ohio and the Tri-State area of Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana. conditions and damages which have affected the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Bridge that Ohio shares maintenance responsibility with Kentucky, and which has created dangerous WHEREAS, a catastrophic accident occurred on November 11, 2020 on the Brent Spence

WHEREAS, a truck hauling potassium hydroxide and an unknown amount of diesel fuel crashed into a jackknifed truck at 2:45 a.m. on the northbound deck;

WHEREAS, the fire from this accident lasted for two hours, damaging the upper deck of the Brent Spence Bridge, which contains the southbound lanes of the highway, as well as damaging the lower area beneath that carries the northbound lanes. will be determined through bridge inspections; WHEREAS, the actual extent of the structural damage to the bridge is unknown at this time but

effort between both states and the Federal Highway Administration; lead on the Brent Spence Bridge. The inspection and solution process following this incident will be a joint WHEREAS, Ohio and Kentucky have an agreement which states that Kentucky is the maintenance

pursuant to 23 CFR 668 for the repair of the Federal Aid Highway System; WHEREAS, to recover related expenses from the Federal Emergency Relief Program

Administration. Any damage claims to the Federal Aid Highway System must be made through the Ohio Department of Transportation; repairs by contract method or by ODOT or Kentucky maintenance forces where appropriate, and that ODOT and Kentucky can enter these contracts in partnership with the Federal Highway WHEREAS, in the interest of public safety and convenience, it is proposed to perform

the Federal funding time period; and To the extent possible, this work commenced on November 11, 2020, which will be the beginning of WHEREAS, using these methods, the work can be completed in a minimum amount of time.
