- WHEREAS, 2022 marks the 85th Anniversary of the National Apprenticeship Act; and National Apprenticeship Week recognizes the value that Registered Apprenticeships are creating in the workforce of today and tomorrow, and their ability to grow more industries than ever before; and
- WHEREAS, the health of Iowa's workforce is directly dependent on the creation of long-term pipelines, which remain paramount to the success of our economy, our communities, and ultimately our state; and
- WHEREAS, Registered Apprenticeship programs are now driving access to high-demand careers through unique learning models that are creating meaningful experiences for apprentices who earn while they learn; and
- WHEREAS, the establishment of new Registered Apprenticeship programs must be supported to help fulfill Iowa's workforce needs, including in education, health care, advanced manufacturing and other fields that have been greatly impacted by the pandemic and recent workforce challenges; and
- WHEREAS, the State of Iowa recognizes the thousands of employers, apprentices, and community partners that make Registered Apprenticeships a reality, which continues to benefit the economy and raise the bar for success in meeting our recruitment and retention needs; and
- WHEREAS, Registered Apprenticeship programs are creating innovative solutions that help employers adapt in order to create their own talent pipeline, and that these programs will remain a key tool for the state's evolving needs in workforce development.
