

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Favourable conservation status (FCS)




- Criteria
 - Extinction / carrying capacity ?
 - Demographic / genetic / ecological ?
- □ Scale
 - Local AND national / national biogeographical / transboundary
 - Transboundary:
 - Not with 'third states' like Russia
 - Population-level cooperation as condition?


"assessment ... at both local level and the level of the territory of that Member State or, where applicable, at the level of the biogeographical region in question where the borders of that Member State straddle several biogeographical regions or if the natural range of the species so requires and, to the extent possible, at cross-border level" (Case C-674/17, 2019)

Hunting / derogations (1)



- Annex V conditions:
 - ☐ FCS
 - Monitoring
 - Means
- Annex IV same conditions + Article 16(1):
 - ☐ Reason (a)-(e) (e.g., preventing livestock damage)
 - No satisfactory alternative
 - ☐ Not impair FCS





'Tolerance hunting' - Case C-674/17 (2019)

- > "combating poaching can be ... an objective covered by Article 16(1)(e)"
- > Strict conditions:
 - Suitability
 - Absence of satisfactory alternatives
 - Influence on conservation status

"in accordance with the precautionary principle ..., if, after examining the best scientific data available, significant doubt remains as to whether or not a derogation will be detrimental to ... conservation status, the Member State must refrain from granting or implementing that derogation."

Hunting / derogations (3)



Scope for lethal management – key variables:

- Conservation status
- Quality of scientific evidence
- Quality of safeguards in laws & plans
- Extent & quality of transboundary population-level cooperation





Zoning

- Zones where wolves treated favourably -> OK
- Zones where wolves treated unfavourably -> depends
- No go / low density areas -> options limited, especially under Annex II & IV

Hybridization

- Government-controlled removal of hybrids
- Protection of hybrids from public at large
