NATIONAL ESEA DISTINGUISHED SCHOOL AWARD WINNERS

The Wyoming Department of Education has announced Shoshoni Elementary School in Fremont County School District #24 and Stagecoach Elementary School in Sweetwater County School District #1 as the 2020 National ESEA Distinguished School Award winners.

The National Association of ESEA (Elementary and Secondary Education Act) State Program Administrators selects examples of superior federally-funded school programs for national recognition through the National ESEA Distinguished Schools Program. Schools are selected by state educational agencies and must qualify under one of the following categories:

- Exceptional student performance and academic growth for two or more consecutive years.
- Closing the achievement gap between student groups for two or more consecutive years.
- Excellence in serving special populations of students (homeless, English learners, etc.).

Stagecoach Elementary closed the achievement gap in reading and mathematics between third and fourth grade students from the 2017-18 school year to the 2018-19 school year and Shoshoni Elementary
