**ORDER<sup>1</sup>**

The Motion to Dismiss paragraphs 6, 8, and 9 of the complaint filed by Respondents Envision Physician Services, LLC and Arizona EM-I Medical Services, P.C. is denied. The Respondents have failed to demonstrate that there are no genuine issues of material fact warranting a hearing and that they are entitled to judgment as a matter of law.<sup>2</sup> This denial is without prejudice to the Respondents' right to renew their arguments before the Administrative Law Judge and, if necessary, before the Board on any exceptions that may be filed to the Administrative Law Judge's decision.
