# **General Information**

# **Administrative/Supervisory**

#### 2021-2022 FY PSU Annual Determinations

During the COVID pandemic, the OEC posted PSU annual determinations (i.e., Meets Requirements, Needs Assistance, etc.) along with the PSUs public report regarding performance on each indicator and whether the PSU met its local targets using the <u>EC Annual Report Indicators Dashboard</u>. While the data regarding the PSU's performance on each indicator target is still publicly reported at this site, the determination will return to an individual notification to each PSU.

The 2021-2022 FY PSU Annual Determination will be emailed to local leadership (Superintendent/Director of Schools/EC) within the next 5-10 business days. Included in this email will be a separate notification regarding compliance with Indicator 11 and Indicator 12 requirements for the same reporting period.

Please review this communication carefully as the OEC is transitioning to combining these notification requirements into a timeline and bundle that is conducive to local improvement planning.

# **Private School Proportionate Share**

The federal funds set aside for Proportionate Share is a federal requirement to make equitable services available for parentally placed private school students and must be expended from the PRC 060 funds. The use of these funds must be tracked through an established method. If the PSU expends all of the federal set aside funds for equitable services, then state or local funds <u>can</u> be used to supplement; however it is not required and is at the discretion of the PSU.

Federal Policy Section 300.133: (d) Supplement, not supplant. State and local funds may supplement and in no case supplant the proportionate amount of Federal funds required to be expended for parentally-placed private school children with disabilities under this part.

#### **PRC 118 Grant Award Notification**

PRC 118 Grant Award Notifications (GAN) are being auto-generated through the CCIP system. PRC 118 funds cover related services recruitment and retention funding, autism funding, de-escalation funds, and some

contract personnel. The GANS currently being released show a \$0.00 amount for funding. This is CORRECT because allotments for the 2023-2024 fiscal year have not been made.

#### 2022-2023 FY FEDERAL REPORTING: Child Exit Count

During September, the federal Child Exit Count is collected for students exiting special education between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023. The correction and certification schedule is documented in the OEC Activities Guide and listed below:

September 15, 2023: Exit Count Opens for all PSUs

September 29, 2023: Exit Count Closes - Final Certification Due

#### 2022-2023 FY FEDERAL REPORTING: Indicator 11 - Child Find

All PSUs are responsible for certifying Indicator 11: Child Find in ECATS. Indicator 11 count collects the percent of students for whom a referral was received, evaluation conducted, and placement determined within 90 days. The data collection period is July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. The correction and certification schedule is documented in the OEC Activities Guide and listed below:

October 2, 2023: Exit Count Opens for all PSUs

October 31, 2023: Exit Count Closes - Final Certification Due

#### 2022-2023 FY FEDERAL REPORTING: Indicator 12 - Early Childhood Transition

Indicator 12 collects data for the percentage of children found Part B eligible with an IEP implemented by the 3rd birthday. The data collection period is July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023.

Indicator 12 data will be submitted by traditional public school units using <u>this spreadsheet</u>. The spreadsheet has a tab with helpful clarifications to assist PSUs with entering their data and can be submitted at any time prior to the due date of October 31, 2023.

The council has 30 members, each serving a two-year term. The governor appoints all members. 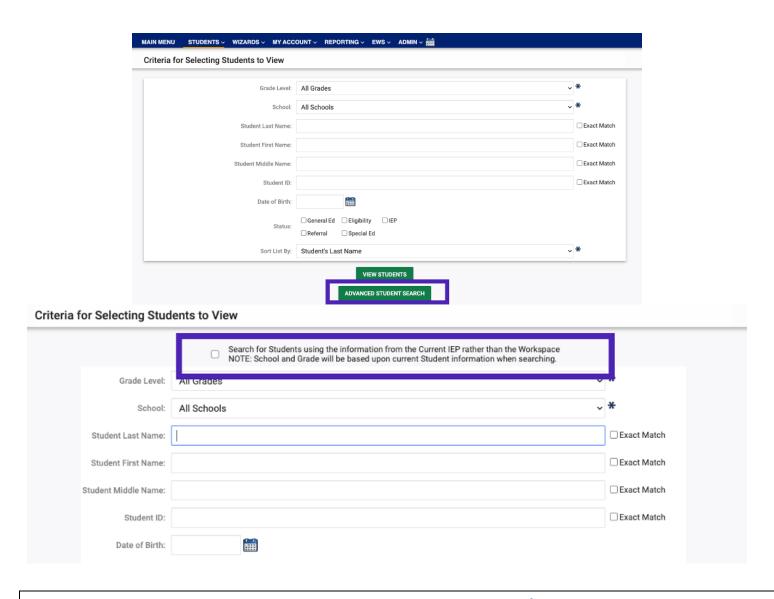

#### **Advanced Student Search in ECATS**

Users will need to click the radio button at the top of the screen to ensure the information is being pulled from the *Current IEP* rather than the *Workspace*. As a reminder, the workspace represents documents that are being drafted in preparation for IEP Team meetings. Current IEP ensures that the student search pulls students for whom a finalized IEP is in place.

# **Application for Autism Model Programming Sites**

The Autism Model Program Site (AMPS) initiative is intended to increase capacity in the implementation of evidence-based autism programming to improve outcomes for students with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Using an Implementation Science framework, NCDPI autism consultants work collaboratively with selected

Public School Units (PSUs) to leverage existing infrastructure and resources, including the PSU's Autism Support Team, to address critical components of capacity building.

We are pleased to announce that a new cohort will be added for the 2023-2024 year. To begin the process of becoming an Autism Model Program Site, your PSU will need to complete the application as a team. Selected applicants will receive an additional \$3,000.00 in PRC 118 Autism funding to support the requirements of being a part of this initiative.
