Report Highlights:

On March 20th, 2020 the Salvadoran Legislative Assembly issued decree 604 temporarily eliminating import tariffs on certain products to guarantee sufficient supply during the COVID-19 emergency. Also, on March 30th, the government of El Salvador set maximum sales prices for basic food products sold at the wholesale and retail level.





The Salvadoran Legislative Assembly issued decree 604 eliminating import tariffs on certain products due to the COVID-19 emergency. Food products included are: red kidney beans, milled rice, corn flour, rice flour, wheat flour and homogenized vegetables. In the case of red beans, the Ministry of Economy (MINEC) set a 25,000 metric ton import quota that would be allowed duty free. MINEC also set a 7,500 metric ton quota for milled rice to be imported duty free.

In addition, on March 30th, 2020 the government of El Salvador through the Consumer Protection Agency issued maximum prices for basic food products at the wholesale and retail levels (13% Value-Added-Tax included)
