

The services described in this brochure are funded, in part, with Federal funds awarded by the U.S. Department of Education under the Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) and the Independent Living Services for Older Individuals Who are Blind (OIB) programs. For purposes of the VR program, the Federal VR grant paid 78.7 percent of the total costs of the program. In Federal fiscal year (FFY) 2019, the VR agency received \$14,705,354 in Federal VR funds. Funds appropriated by the State paid 21.3 percent of the total costs (\$3,979,975) under the VR program. For purposes of the OIB program, Federal funds paid 90 percent of the total costs incurred under the program. In FFY 2019, the agency received \$955,236 in Federal grant funds for this program. Funds appropriated by the State paid 10 percent (\$95,524) of the total costs incurred under the OIB program.

Programs



Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)

Our VR program assists eligible individuals find employment, keep the job they have or advance professionally. Working with a DSB VR counselor, individuals will develop an employment goal and create an individualized plan of services and supports to help them achieve that goal.



Independent Living (IL)

Our IL programs provide guidance, comprehensive IL skills training and a connection to vital resources to help people adjust to vision loss and live independently and safely at home and in the community. Eligible individuals will develop independent living goals and create a plan of services and supports to help them achieve that goal.



Medical Eye Care (MEC)

Our Medical Eve Care program may assist eligible North Carolinians who have no other resources for eye care services to obtain eve-related surgeries. treatments and medications.
