LC 68 2020 1st Special Session 6/18/20 (JAS/ps)

SUMMARY

Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt temporary rules establishing emergency temporary infectious disease standard by August 1, 2020. Requires director to adopt by rule permanent infectious disease standard no later than July 31, 2021.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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- 2 Relating to infectious disease standards; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2020 special session Act are added to and made a part of ORS chapter 654.
- 6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) As used in this section and section 3 of this 2020 special session Act:
- 8 (a) "Administrative controls" means managerial measures taken by
 9 an employer, including but not limited to changes in workplace poli10 cies or standard operating procedures, to reduce the risk of occupa11 tional exposure.
- 12 **(b) "Agricultural worker" has the meaning given that term in ORS** 13 **315.163.**
- 14 (c) "Clinical laboratory" has the meaning given that term in ORS 15 438.010.
- 16 (d) "Emergency medical services provider" has the meaning given that term in ORS 682.025.
- 18 (e) "Engineering controls" means protective control measures, in-19 cluding but not limited to the installation of physical barriers or

- high-efficiency ventilation systems, to reduce, isolate or remove the risk of occupational exposure.
- 3 (f) "Food processor" has the meaning given that term in ORS 4 307.455.
- (g) "Grocery store or food market" has the meaning given that term
 in ORS 616.850.
- 7 (h) "Health care facility" has the meaning given that term in ORS 8 442.015.
- 9 (i) "Health care worker" means a person who is licensed or certified 10 to provide health care under ORS chapter 677, 678, 679, 680, 684 or 685 11 or an employee of a health care facility, of a licensed health care 12 provider or of a clinical laboratory.
 - (j) "Occupational exposure" means the reasonably anticipated exposure to agents of transmissible infectious diseases resulting from a worker's performance of job duties.
 - (k) "Personal protective equipment" means specialized clothing, equipment or products designed to create a barrier to penetration of substances or solid, liquid or airborne particles, or to minimize exposure to hazards that may cause serious illness, including but not limited to:
- 21 (A) Surgical face masks;

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- 22 (B) Disposable gloves; or
- 23 (C) Eye protection, including goggles or face shields.
- (2) No later than August 1, 2020, the Director of the Department of
 Consumer and Business Services shall adopt temporary rules establishing an emergency temporary infectious disease standard to address
 the immediate health risks posed by occupational exposure and impose
 control measures designed to protect workers against such exposure.
- 29 (3) Temporary rules adopted under this section shall be adopted in 30 accordance with ORS 183.335 (5) and shall be effective until the direc-31 tor adopts rules pursuant to section 3 of this 2020 special session Act.

- 1 (4) At a minimum, the emergency temporary infectious disease 2 standard established under this section must:
- (a) Categorize workers who may be susceptible to elevated levels of risk of occupational exposure while working, including but not limited to:
- 6 (A) Health care workers;
- 7 (B) Emergency medical service providers;
- 8 (C) Grocery store or food market personnel;
- 9 (D) Clinical laboratory personnel;
- 10 **(E) Food processors**;
- 11 (F) Agricultural workers; or
- 12 (G) Public transit operators.
- 13 (b) Establish requirements for the selection, use, cleaning and dis-14 posal of personal protective equipment based on the level of risk of 15 occupational exposure in a specific workspace and the availability of 16 equipment.
- 17 (c) Incorporate a framework for implementing the following control 18 measures to mitigate or eliminate the risk of occupational exposure, 19 prioritized in the following order:
- 20 (A) Engineering controls;
- 21 **(B) Administrative controls;**
- 22 (C) Safe work practices; and
- 23 (D) Personal protective equipment.
- 24 (d) Establish a risk-based model to help employers assess the level 25 of risk of occupational exposure in a particular workplace setting, 26 identify sources of potential exposure and adopt specific measures to 27 address the exposure risks identified in that setting.
- SECTION 3. (1) The Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services shall, no later than July 31, 2021, adopt by rule a permanent infectious disease standard to address occupational exposure and to impose required protective measures to protect workers

	1	against	the	risks	of	such	exposure.
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(2) The permanent infectious disease standard adopted under this section may be based in part on the emergency temporary infectious disease standard described in section 2 of this 2020 special session Act.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2020 special session Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2020 special session Act takes effect on its passage.
