Parent Notifications: Parent/Guardian Notification of Reading Difficulty & Participation in Intervention

As highlighted during the EC Director's May Institute, the Office of Early Learning, Integrated Academic and Behavior Support, and the EC Division, collaborated to combine the parent notification requirements for SB 387 (Individual Reading Plans) and IDEA requirements for response to intervention. There are three options for these notifications. This information was communicated to MTSS implementers, which included coordinators (PBIS/MTSS/SEL, during the Regional Networking Meetings in early May. The sample letters for these three options are linked on the attached summary. Please be reminded that Option #2 is the required letter for participation in intervention as required by the IDEA and shared as part of the statewide corrective action for specific learning disabilities. Options #1 communicates SB 387 requirements only, while Option #3 communicates SB 387 and IDEA requirements concurrently. (ATTACHED)

Revisions to IDEA Grants

When a revision is made to the IDEA budgets (PRCs 049, 060, 070, 185, 186 & 187), the grant narrative Use of Funds must align with the budget. If a Use of Funds revision is needed, it must be made in the narrative Use of Funds section. The PSU can start a revision after the grant has been approved and make any changes necessary for the alignment of the Use of Funds and the budget. The grant revision and the budget revision will be reviewed by the fiscal consultant after submission of the revision. The revision cannot be indicated in the history log.

Revisions to CARES Act-ESSERF-Exceptional Children Grant (PRC 167)

When a revision is made to the CARES Act-ESSERF-Exceptional Children Grant PRC 167 budget, the grant narrative Use of Funds must align with the budget. If a Use of Funds revision is needed, it must be made in the 2021 CARES Act-ESSERF-Exceptional Children Grant application. The PSU can start a revision after the grant has been approved and make any changes necessary for the alignment of the Use of Funds and the budget. The grant revision and the budget revision will be reviewed by the fiscal consultant after submission of the revision. The revision cannot be indicated in the history log of the grant application.



PK EC Items of Interest

Transitioning from Pre-K to Kindergarten

In accordance with the Excellent Public Schools Act of 2021, a formative assessment must be administered at the end of the Pre-K school year, and the results of the assessment must be shared with the receiving kindergarten teacher. NC DPI, NC Department of Health and Human Services, and Teaching Strategies have collaborated to create a Transition Report to address this legislative requirement and support the state's transition to kindergarten efforts.

All pre-k teachers in public schools, as well as teachers in community-based NC Pre-K programs, will complete a Transition Report within Teaching Strategies GOLD® for each child in their class no later than May 31. Transition Reports will be transferred to receiving kindergarten teachers via NC ELI as the new school year begins, providing information about a child's knowledge, skills, and abilities related to Widely Held Expectations for child development.

PRC 029 Funds 2022-2023 Updates

Please review your 2021-2022 PRC 029 budget and ensure all funds will be encumbered by **Thursday**, **June 30**, **2022**.

PRC 029 Request for Funding is now OPEN

The application process for the PRC 029 grant is open for the 2022-2023 school year. A special budget provision in the 1999 Appropriation Act modified the use of these state dollars to allow expenditure of PRC 029 funds to provide services to "(i) children with special needs who were identified as members of the Willie M class at the time of dissolution of the class, and (ii) other children with special needs." This provision provides the flexibility for PSUs to use these PRC 029 funds for services for students who have significant behavioral and emotional needs in public schools.

This application process will allow PSUs to complete a Comprehensive Needs Grant. The final submission deadline is **Friday**, **July 1**, **2022**.

The application requires each PSU to identify services and indicators that measure the effectiveness of these supports. Prioritization will be given to innovative grant proposals that are designed to address the critical need for identified students.

All students eligible for PRC 029 services must have a completed <u>Entrance Tool</u>. The Entrance Tool must be submitted during the time that the grant is open.
