ORDER¹

The Respondent's Motion to Dismiss the complaint is denied. The Respondent has not demonstrated that the complaint fails to state a claim upon which relief can be granted. Contrary to the Respondent's assertion, the complaint provides sufficient information to satisfy the notice-pleading requirements of Section 102.15 of the Board's Rules. Further, the Respondent has failed to establish that there are no genuine issues of material fact warranting a hearing and that it is entitled to judgment as a matter of law.²
