What is it?

The Leaders of Character Initiative, sponsored in part by the West Point Societies of Greater Cincinnati, will be holding its Ninth annual Leadership and Ethics Seminar Friday, February 5, 2021 at Springdale Nazarene Church (SNC) 11177 Springfield Pike, Cincinnati, Ohio 45246.

Schools may register 3-4 *combined sophomore and/or junior students* and *one or two total teacher(s)/administrator(s)* from each selected high school. Attendees will have the opportunity to experience the leadership and ethics training previously only available to West Point faculty and cadets.

This seminar will run from 8:00 AM - 3:00 PM, includes breakfast and lunch, and is free to those registered participants selected by their schools to attend.

Can you train leadership?

There are no 'natural' leaders – leadership is a skill that must be trained and honed. Effective leaders have clearly identified personal values and an ethical framework that enables them to listen and to motivate others and make

Proven Record of Success

The Leaders of Character Initiative was started in 2012 by members of the West Point Society of Cincinnati. The initiative has two primary goals: 1. Identify and Build New Leaders of Character and 2. the 'tough' decisions when called for in difficult situations.

Why would students and administrators want to go?

Through a four-year leadership program, West Point seeks to "educate, train, and inspire the Corps of Cadets, so that each graduate is a commissioned leader of character." Cadets are taught, practice and live in an environment that develops this leadership character for 4 years.

Now Greater Cincinnati area students and administrators have the opportunity to benefit from a portion of this program. This one-day seminar will be facilitated by current West Point graduates from the business and professional community. After a short workshop to understand and establish each person's value and beliefs framework, small groups of students will be led through discussion of several situational case studies relevant to them. These cases will enable them to explore application of their personal values within an ethical decision-making model - helping students develop and internalize a personal code of conduct that will make them stronger leaders.
