### Initiative 1: Planning – Establish a Foundation for Success

FCPS Response	
The current FCPS IT vision embraces equitable access to meaningful learning experiences and technology that supports student growth and development both at school and at home. Successfully using technology is critical to helping students attain Portrait of a Graduate attributes such as communication, collaboration, and critical thinking. FCPS technology offerings, including FCPSOn, help prepare students to meet those demands. This vision creates a shared responsibility between school	

and home that thoughtfully supports students and families as they incorporate these new learning strategies. We acknowledge that technology and devices will not replace teachers. On the contrary, the technology vision for FCPS provides ongoing, dynamic professional learning for teachers that will result in more purposeful and collaborative student learning experiences. This vision forms the foundation for achieving Portrait of a Graduate outcomes for students.

The Leadership Team will meet as a group to refine the technology vision for the division after the head of IT is named.

The roll-out should be modeled after the FCPSOn approach and jointly led by the Office of the CIO and IS under the direct supervision of the Superintendent.	Complete

The Schoology implementation will provide all students with:

There are 17 schools that are participating in the Schoology pilot for the 2020-2021 school year. These schools include: Churchill Road ES, Cooper MS, Edison HS, Franconia ES, Hayfield ES, Hayfield SS, Irving MS, Kilmer MS, Langley HS, London Towne ES, Marshall HS, Rolling Valley ES, Stenwood ES, Stone MS, Twain MS, West Springfield HS, and Westfield HS. Schools were selected to ensure a wide range of programs and diversity between schools. Lessons learned during the pilot will inform divisionwide implementation. Preparation for the divisionwide implementation has already begun and will continue throughout the 2020-2021 school year to include professional development and stakeholder engagement.	

The implementation is being led jointly by Instructional Services and Information Technology. Implementation teams include representatives from Early Childhood, Special Services, and ESOL.

# Initiative 2: Staffing - Leadership and Technical Resources

Recommendation	Status
Hire a CIO: Retract the current CIO posting and refine the job description. This role should be at the top level of the organization, reporting into the Superintendent. Look for a candidate with IT modernization experience, specifically around Cloud and SaaS based solutions. The CIO must be hired prior to the end of the summer. This role is critical for the development of the long-term strategic plan for FCPS.	Complete

Recommendation	Status
Hire a CISO: Hire a CISO prior to the end of the summer consistent with our feedback on the job description. This role should be at the top level of the organization, reporting into the Superintendent and not the CIO. The CISO role is critical for the development of the long-term strategic plan for FCPS. FCPS is crafting the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) job description, by the Technology Advisory Council.	to be reviewed

Recommendation	Status
Contact Center Support: Retain a multi-channel (i.e., phone, email, etc.) Contact Center Support contractor prior to the start of the school year. This service desk should be focused on assisting the parents of the FCPS students at the start of the 2020-21 school year. The workstream has identified this as a risk and potential failure should FCPS be unable to address the concerns of the parents, students, and faculty as school restarts in the Fall 2020.	In Progress
FCPS Response	
FCPS has contracted for help desk services specifically to support parents this fall. The Parent Help Desk will provide a toll-free number that parents can call directly for tech support for common issues. The service will include multi-lingual support.	
The Parent Help Desk will be integrated with FCPS in order to allow escalation of tickets that cannot be resolved with basic technology support.	

### Initiative 3: FCPS Infrastructure and Processes Alignment to Support Educational Success

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Response	
Members of the Technology Advisory Council reviewed the Schoology Contract SLAs. The only risk gap identified in this review was the need for more explicit information regarding how Schoology handles load testing within the joint-tenant, Software as a Service (SAAS) environment.	
nas raised this issue with Schoology and Powerschool, the Schoology P neetings were held in July 2020 and follow up discussions are scheduled	
Additionally, it should be noted that the FCPS Schoology contract includes a 99.9% up-time requirement with penalties and refunds in the event this performance level is not achieved. This is a higher-level support agreement than the standard agreement offered by Schoology.	

Recommendation	Status
Core Technologies for Fall 2020: Identify a recommended set of core technologies for Fall 2020 by school grouping (e.g. elementary) or communities of practice (e.g. grade level) and determine roll-out plan in conjunction with Professional Development plan.	Complete
FCPS Response	

FCPS has updated our Digital Ecosystem Library, which lists tools that have been evaluated for instructional alignment as well technical functionality. This library has numerous search options, indicates the approval status for software applications, provides links to privacy policies and terms of use, and links to the vendors website where users can find support materials. Links to the FCPS Digital Ecosystem are bookmarked on all teachers' desktops.

The project team and timeline have been established for the RFP. The RFP has been released to vendors and closes on August 31. The work is on target to award the contract in time to pilot in the spring.	

### **Initiative 4: Resource Support for Educators**

Recommendation	Status
Provide Differentiated Educator Professional Development: Prepare and deliver PD in multiple formats (e.g., asynchronous modules, how- to videos, synchronous sessions, sample interactive learning templates) to plan for online and hybrid learning environments.	In Progress
FCPS Response	
A number of professional development opportunities on virtual learning were offered to staff during the summer. This included traditional FCPS Academy courses, self-paced asynchronous learning activities, and the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) Summer Learning Academy. ISTE courses were provided to all Great Beginnings participants (1,040).	
During August Inservice all teachers will complete required PD designed to prepare them and their students for success with virtual learning. For example, teachers will be provided with strategies and resources to ensure they can build relationships with students in a virtual classroom, create learning environments in which learning materials are accessible to all students, and can engage students during virtual instruction using whole class, small group, and individual instructional strategies and supports.	

A Return to School Teaching hub has also been established which provides numerous resources that support instructional planning and delivery in the current virtual environment.
