- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts collection, storage or use of diffuse surface water from falling rain, melting snow or other precipitation from requirement to obtain water right permit or certificate.

- **SB** 662 Sponsored by Senator LINTHICUM (Presession filed.) -- Relating to water rights.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes criteria for determining existence or lack of new ground water use impairment or interference with water right having earlier priority date.

- **SB** 663 Sponsored by Senator LINTHICUM (Presession filed.) -- Relating to parental rights; prescribing an effective date.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits Department of Human Services from disclosing records and reports related to child abuse investigations to certain entities unless court finds report of abuse is founded.

- SB 664 Sponsored by Senator LINTHICUM (Presession filed.) -- Relating to allowable green energy technology in public improvement contracts; prescribing an effective date.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Expands definition of "green energy technology" for purposes of public improvement contracts.

- <u>SB</u> <u>665</u> Sponsored by Senator LINTHICUM (Presession filed.) -- Relating to reporting requirements for labor organizations.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk

Requires labor organization that is exclusive representative of public employees to prepare annual financial disclosure report describing labor organization's expenditures of moneys collected by and paid to labor organization.

- <u>SB</u> <u>666</u> Sponsored by Senator LINTHICUM (Presession filed.) -- Relating to public meetings.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies public meeting notice requirements for meetings held in executive session.

- <u>SB</u> <u>667</u> Sponsored by Senator GORSEK; Representative REARDON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to ownership rights to teacher-created intellectual property.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires school district to adopt and implement policy concerning ownership rights to teacher-created intellectual property.

- <u>SB</u> <u>668</u> Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) --Relating to law enforcement body-worn cameras; prescribing an effective date.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study issues related to requiring all law enforcement agencies to use body-worn cameras and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021.

- SB 669 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to apprenticeship.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires certain mass transit and transportation districts to be registered apprenticeship training agents as condition of receiving distributions from Statewide Transportation Improvement Fund.

- SB 670 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) --Relating to matters concerning apprenticeship programs as mandatory subject of collective bargaining.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Includes matters concerning apprenticeship or training program administered by certain mass transit districts as mandatory subject of collective bargaining for employees of district.

- SB 671 Sponsored by Senator HEARD, Representative BREESE-IVERSON; Senators FINDLEY, LINTHICUM, THATCHER, Representatives MOORE-GREEN, NEARMAN, OWENS, POST, RESCHKE, STARK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to abortion; prescribing an effective date.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk

Prohibits abortion unless health care provider has first determined probable gestational age of unborn child, except in case of medical emergency.

- <u>SB</u> <u>672</u> Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.) -- Relating to assault of health care workers; prescribing an effective date.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Expands crime of assault in the third degree to include physical injury to health care worker performing official duties.

- SB 673 Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.) -- Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds under Article XI-Q of Oregon Constitution for construction of veterans' home in Roseburg, Oregon.

SB 674 Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.) -- Relating to hospital visitation during a pandemic; declaring an emergency.

1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to investigate best practices and latest technology and to establish hospital procedures to enable family members to visit hospitalized patients during pandemic.

- <u>SB</u> <u>675</u> Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the salvage of timber.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Instructs State Forestry Department to establish by rule pilot program to encourage salvage of timber from lands owned or managed by State Board of Forestry or department that have been affected by wildfire.

- <u>SB</u> <u>676</u> Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.) -- Relating to state agency budget information; declaring an emergency.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk

Requires state agencies to submit policy option proposals developed for purposes of Governor's budget to specified legislative leaders.

- <u>SB</u> <u>677</u> Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.) -- Relating to unemployment insurance; declaring an emergency.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk

Authorizes Director of Employment Department to enter into contracts with third parties to process claims for unemployment insurance benefits when there is unforeseeable increase due to public health emergency.

- <u>SB</u> <u>678</u> Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to statewide assessments of students; declaring an emergency.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows parent or adult student to excuse student from taking statewide standardized assessments by completing form.

- **SB** 679 Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to mandatory subjects of collective bargaining.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Amends definition of "employment relations" to include class size and caseload limits as mandatory collective bargaining subjects for school districts.

- SB 680 Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (at the request of Kevin Fitts) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to residential peer support for individuals with mental illness who are in crisis; declaring an emergency.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides funding to peer-run organizations in Portland metropolitan area, southern Oregon region and eastern and central Oregon region to operate peer respite centers to provide peer respite services to individuals with mental illness who experience acute distress, anxiety or emotional pain.

- Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (at the request of Oregon Society of Addiction Medicine (State Chapter of American Society of Addiction Medicine)) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to setting aside convictions.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes procedure for person with qualifying conviction for possession of controlled substance to file motion requesting court order setting aside conviction.

- SB 682 Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (at the request of Alexandria Goddard) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to suicide prevention; declaring an emergency.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Adult Suicide Intervention and Prevention Coordinator within Oregon Health Authority.

- SB 683 Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (at the request of Jeff Wihtol) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to instruction on racist history; declaring an emergency.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires school districts to provide instruction on racist history of this country and state.

- SB 684 Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (at the request of Elizebeth R. Harmon) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Task Force on the Oregon Medical Board; declaring an emergency.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Oregon Medical Board.

- <u>SB</u> <u>685</u> Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to Governor's assignment of law enforcement officers.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits Governor to allocate, assign and make available law enforcement officers from one law enforcement unit to another law enforcement unit to assist other law enforcement unit in performance of law enforcement services.

- <u>SB</u> <u>686</u> Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (at the request of Ann Kasper, MA, PSS) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to mental health care.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes right to receive inpatient psychiatric care in person and on-site.

- <u>SB</u> <u>687</u> Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to meeting needs of certain student groups to improve academic outcomes.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires school district applying for grant from Student Investment Account to specify how mental and behavioral health needs of certain students will be met with moneys from grant.

- SB 688 Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (at the request of City of Portland) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to arbitration proceedings concerning law enforcement officer conduct.
- 1-11(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Employment Relations Board to conduct study relating to standards applied in arbitration proceedings involving alleged misconduct by law enforcement officers and to submit report of board's findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.
