Military-Connected Students

- Approximately 915,000 school-age DoD military dependents*
- School-age dependents of military personnel are faced with numerous transitions during their formative years
- On average, military children move 3x more often than civilian peers^
- Military dependents who move from one school to another during high school years are faced with special challenges to learning and future achievement
- Texas is home to 15 active-duty military installations and nearly 200,000 military-connected students



Federal and Statutory Authority

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), 2015 requires reporting of assessment data for military-connected students

TEC §25.006 requires LEAs to collect data on military-connected students ("Military Student Identifier or MSI")

TEC §33.909 Purple Star Campus Designation

Effective 2020-21 School Year, Awarded Annually

TAC Title 19 Chapter 61FF (Commissioner's Rule §61.1063)



Purple Star Campus Designation




- Created by 86th Legislature (SB 1577)
- Recognizes campuses for demonstrating support and commitment to meeting the unique needs of militaryconnected students and their families
- Effective 2020-21 school year – 4th year of program



Purple Star Campus Designation

- Criteria
 - Campus-based military liaison
 - Webpage for military-connected families
 - Student-led campus transition program
 - Professional development for staff
 - Participation in at least one of three initiatives to support military-connected students and families.
- Designation lasts for 2 years
- Congratulations to previous designees





- Designate <u>LEA staff member</u> as a military liaison
- Duties Include:
 - Identifying military-connected students enrolled and ensure PEIMS "military identifier" is correct;
 - Serve as POC between the campus and militaryconnected students and their families;
 - Determine appropriate campus services available to military-connected students; and
 - Assist in coordinating campus programs relevant to military-connected students


Simply provide a copy of a military order requiring your transfer to a military installation in or adjacent to the district's attendance zone. The parent or guardian has up to 10 days of the arrival date specified in the order to provide North East ISD with proof of residence.


Sample Internet Page - NEISD





Sample Internet Page – Socorro ISD












Pause to Process









- Maintain a <u>transition program</u> (led by students) that assists military-connected students in transitioning to the campus
- Must be sponsored by a staff member, but does not have to be the campus-based military liaison
- Activities can include:
 - Tours of the campus
 - Walk student schedule
 - Lunch Buddy
 - Location/practice opening locker






- Activities can include (Con't):
 - Invitation to campus events and activities
 - Introduction to key members of the staff (e.g. principals, counselors, registrar, librarian, attendance clerk, etc.)
 - Operational orientation (e.g. how *to add money to lunch account, where to turn in absence notes, hall passes, bus and parent pick up/drop off, etc.)



Student Transition Programs



















 Offer <u>professional development for Staff</u> members on issues related to military-connected students

 Can be done by campus-based military liaison, installation liaison or by a guest speaker from military advocacy group

- Topics may include:
 - Researched-based information on findings from studies of military-connected students;
 - Helping students build resilience




- Topics may include (Con't):
 - Identifying and supporting students that struggle due to issues such as deployments or other areas that may cause separation
 - Becoming a Purple Star Campus
 - Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission or MIC³
 - Assisting military-connected students with college applications and other post-high school choices; and many, many more!





Offer at least one of the following initiatives:

- A resolution showing support for militaryconnected students and their families;
- Recognition of the Month of the Military Child (April) or Military Family Appreciation Month (November) with relevant events hosted at the campus; or
- A partnership with a local military installation that provides opportunities for active-duty military members to volunteer at the campus, speak at an assembly or host a field trip.



Overview:

The Purple Star Campus Designation recognizes Texas school district and open-enrollment charter school campuses that show their support and commitment to meeting the unique needs of military-connected students and their families. The Texas Education Agency (TEA) accepted applications for the 2023-2024 school year from April 3, 2023, through June 2, 2023, for campuses to apply for the designation and demonstrate they have met the established criteria:

- Designating a campus-based military liaison;
- Creating and maintaining an easily accessible web page that includes information for militaryconnected students and their families;
- 3. Implementing a campus transition program; and
- 4. Offering at least one of the following initiatives:
 - A resolution showing support for military-connected students and families;
 - o Participation in Month of the Military Child or Military Family Month; or
 - Partnership with a school liaison officer to encourage and provide opportunities for active-duty military members.

- 4. Offer at least one of the following initiatives:
 - A resolution showing support for military-connected students and families;
 - · Participation in Month of the Military Child or Military Family Month; or
 - Partnership with a school liaison officer to encourage and provide opportunities for active-duty military members.

Recipients of the award receive the following:

- Purple Star recognition to display (See the attached documents).
- Purple Star designations will be featured on the <u>TxSchools.gov</u> web page.





How to Apply

 Application posted late March 2024 on <u>TEA Purple Star campus</u> designation website

*{Tentative} Application Window: April 1, 2024 – June 7, 2024

Begin preparation activities and hosting events NOW

- Be sure to document activities
 - Pictures from events



How to Apply

- Be sure to document activities
 - Screenshots from social media posts, website posts, emails, proclamations, etc.
 - PDFs of presentations (staff development), sign in pages, flyers, banners, posters, etc.
- Upload videos to YouTube, Vimeo, or other web-based video hosting site
- Create a binder or electronic portfolio that can be passed on in case there is a change in campus-based liaison position

Frequently Asked Questions

Does the campus-based liaison have to be an employee of the school district? Answer = YES

Can I work with my school district to help create my easily-accessible website? Answer = YES, however your campus-based site must list the contact information and responsibilities for your campus liaison.

What is the best way to submit collected evidence? Answer: Host videos on YouTube, Vimeo, etc. Post other forms of evidence as PDFs. Yes, these can be hosted or stored in Google Folder.



Frequently Asked Questions

• How soon can I expect to know if our application has been approved to earn the Purple Star Campus designation? Answer = August 2023


