Revised Route 269

Neighborhoods Served:

 Redmond, Sahalee, Pine Lake, Sammamish, Issaquah Highlands Park and Ride, Eastgate, Mercer Island Station

Summary of Proposed Changes:

- Extends service on I-90 to Mercer Island Park and Ride
- Service to Issaquah Transit Center replaced by new Routes 202, 203, and revised ST Express Route 554
- Northern terminal re-oriented to South East Redmond

Why is this change being proposed?

- To provide direct connections to Link light rail for Issaquah and Sammamish
- New Route 215, revised Routes 269 and 218 combine to provide a bus every 5 minutes during the peak hours (5-9 a.m. and 37 p.m.) between Issaquah Highlands and Mercer Island Station

How does this respond to feedback Metro received in Phase 1?

Wider span of service in non-peak hours and weekends

- <u>It provides</u> increased <u>frequency</u> at traditional peak commute hours
- *Frequent The bus comes every 15 minutes or less during peak periods and every 30 minutes or less during off-peak periods.
- *Local All-day bus service that does not meet the standard for frequent.
- *Peak-only The bus comes only 5-9 a.m. and 3-7 p.m. These are the times of day Metro and Sound Transit sees the most riders, usually regular commuting times, Monday through Friday.
