For marketing year 2019/2020, the EU27 imported around 2.2 million tonnes of citrus fruit¹, of which 260 thousand tonnes from Turkey.

This corresponds to legally imported citrus fruits which are required to respect relevant EU laws and requirements including those related to plant-health and residues of plant protection products. The Commission follows, on a regular basis, the evolution of the citrus market².

The citrus market in the EU is characterized by high level of domestic consumption as well as significant intra-EU trade flows. On top of national strategies, there are EU tools at the disposal of EU producers to become even more competitive on the EU market as well as abroad such as promotion programmes³ and the market-management scheme through the set-up of producers organisations and operational programmes.

Currently, consignments of oranges, mandarins, clementines, wilkings and similar citrus hybrids from Turkey are listed in Annex I to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1793⁴, according to which they are subject to an increased level of official controls upon their entry into the EU. The Commission keeps these control measures regarding citrus fruit imported from Turkey under review in the light of available information on control results and on measures taken by the Turkish authorities to ensure compliance of exported consignments with EU legislation.
