The Commission on Unalienable Rights (“Commission”) will meet from 1:15 until 5:30 p.m., on Friday, January 10 at the Department of State in Washington, DC. The meeting will be directed by the Chair of the Commission and Learned Hand Professor of Law at Harvard Law School, Mary Ann Glendon. The Commission serves the U.S. government in a solely advisory capacity and provides advice concerning principles related to human rights. The January 10 meeting will focus on international legal commitments concerning human rights that the United States has entered since World War II. This meeting follows the December 11 meeting on the same topic.

This meeting is open to the public. Entry to the building is controlled. To
