Distracted Driving Safety Corridor Facts

- The corridor is a eight mile stretch of I-77 between state Route 18 and state Route 21. This section will be clearly marked with new signage alerting motorist when they enter and exit the corridor. Motorists should expect increased patrols and enforcement by OSHP.
- From 2019 through 2022, there were 755 total crashes on this stretch of I-77. Of those, 198 resulted in injury and four were fatal crashes. Distracted driving was attributed to 30 of those crashes.
- On January 3, Governor DeWine signed a bill that strengthens distracted driving laws in Ohio. The law goes into effect in April and makes the use of cell phones and other electronic communications devices while driving a primary offense for all drivers and allows law enforcement to immediately pull over a distracted driver upon witnessing the violation.


