Protective Actions are **research-based actions and advice that anyone can take to prepare for, keep safe during, and recover from a disaster.** FEMA has made a substantial effort to validate these Protective Actions. Developing Protective Actions

FEMA develops Protective Actions research by **evaluating peer-reviewed articles, determining messaging,** and **identifying key actions** that can **reduce harm** and **save lives**. After FEMA develops Protective Actions messaging, it collaborates with hazard-specific subject matter experts who provide expert review. FEMA has completed an assessment of more than **380 Protective Actions** based on **275 research studies** and articles by subject matter experts covering 12 hazards and threats.

Before

A little preparation now can make a big difference later. Learn what preparedness actions to take now to protect yourself in case of an emergency.

During

Each emergency is different and may require different actions to keep you and your family safe. Learning what to do during an emergency can help you and your family to stay safe during an emergency.

After

Recovery from a disaster can take time. Get the information you need to help you and your family in the aftermath of an emergency.

People who **have read, seen, or heard preparedness information** are more likely to prepare. In 2020, **47 percent** of people had read, seen, or heard information about how to prepare and **68 percent of households** had taken three or more preparedness actions.
