Weekly Update: Coronavirus Pandemic Whole-of-America Response

Tuesday, July 14

Medical Supplies and Equipment

- As of **July 10**, FEMA, HHS, and the private sector combined have coordinated the delivery of or are currently shipping: 181.8 million N95 respirators, 746.5 million surgical masks, 30.6 million face shields, 329.1 million surgical gowns/coveralls and over 19.1 billion gloves.
- FEMA has shipped 28,562 deliveries of medical supplies to nursing homes to 53 states and territories. FEMA coordinated two shipments totaling a 14-day supply of personal protective equipment to all 15,400 Medicaid and Medicare-certified nursing homes. The shipments are meant to supplement existing efforts to provide equipment to nursing homes.
 - Final shipments in the second wave of deliveries are expected to be completed by July 21.
- In support of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and our nation's veterans, FEMA has coordinated shipments of more than 8.1 million N95 respirator masks, 500,000 surgical masks, more than 3.3 million gloves, 595,360 face shields and 30,000 surgical gowns to facilities across the country.
- The federal government has approximately 48,601 total ventilators available in the Strategic National Stockpile.
- To date, FEMA, HHS, the Cybersecurity Infrastructure and Security Agency (CISA) along with other federal agencies processed and distributed over 346 million cloth face coverings for critical infrastructure workers.

Testing

- As of July 13, CDC, state, local public health labs and other laboratories have tested more than 40.7 million samples.
 - As of **July 10**, the FDA has issued 173 individual <u>emergency use authorizations</u> for test kit manufacturers and laboratories, including 27 antibody tests and two antigen tests.
- To support the Administration's <u>Testing Blueprint</u>, FEMA is working to source and procure testing material – specifically, testing swabs and transport media.
 - As of **July 13**, FEMA has procured and delivered more than 36.9 million swabs and 28 million units of media.
 - □ The FEMA-sourced material will be provided to states, territories and tribes for a limited duration to help increase testing capacity in support of their individualized plans.
- As of July 12, 369,346 samples were collected at federally supported <u>Community-Based Testing</u> <u>Sites</u> and 820,377 samples were processed at public-private partnership testing sites.
 - Out of 41 original Community-Based Testing Sites, 5 will continue to operate as federally supported sites, 24 have transitioned to state management, and 12 have closed in consultation with the states.

- HHS has established a public-private partnership with pharmacy and retail companies to accelerate testing. To find locations, visit the <u>COVID-19 Community-Based Testing Site</u> <u>page</u>.
- As of **July 12**, under the CBTS public-private partnership, there are currently 554 live sites in 48 states and Washington, D.C. conducting testing.

Federal Funding

- Combined, FEMA and HHS have obligated \$133.6 billion in support of COVID-19 efforts.
- All 50 states, five territories, the Seminole Tribe of Florida and Washington, D.C. have been approved for major disaster declarations to assist with additional needs identified.
 - To date, there are 84 tribes working with FEMA, with one tribe that is a direct recipient with a major disaster declaration and an emergency declaration, 43 tribes that are direct recipients with emergency declarations and 41 tribes that are recipients under state declarations.
 - A tribal government may choose to be a subrecipient under a state that has chosen to be a recipient of FEMA assistance, or choose to be a direct recipient of FEMA.
- As of July 10, FEMA has obligated \$8.1 billion in support of COVID-19 efforts. This support includes:
 - Emergency Food and Shelter: \$200 million.
 - Temporary Medical Facilities including medical personnel, mortuary and ambulance services: \$2.5 billion.
 - PPE including medical supplies and pharmaceuticals: \$2.5 billion.
 - National Guard: \$1.7 billion.
 - □ Public Assistance Emergency Protective Measures (Non-PPE): \$1.3 billion.
 - Commodities: \$27 million.
 - Crisis Counseling: \$53-million.

Additional Federal Support

- FEMA has 2,268 employees supporting COVID-19 pandemic response out of a total 20,449 agency employees ready to respond to other emergencies should they occur.
- To date, the President has approved 50 National Guard requests for federal support for the use of National Guard personnel in a Title 32 duty status through August 21.
 - As of July 12, 26,299 National Guard troops have activated in T-32 duty status and 358 troops have activated in State Active Duty status to help with testing and other response efforts.
- As of July 13, the CDC has 5,919 personnel supporting the outbreak response.
- As of July 13, HHS has 379 personnel supporting the outbreak response.
- As of July 14, 97 agencies across 29 states, the District of Columbia, three tribes and one U.S. territory have sent a total of 350 alerts containing information on COVID-19 to cell phones and other wireless devices via the WEA system, and 74 alerts to radios/televisions via EAS.
