71 a. Shares the doubts expressed by many human rights defence organisations and also by the European Data Protection Board, which have highlighted that an intensive use of video devices led by AI applications would imply major risks for data protection, limit to a disproportionate extent the possibilities for anonymous movement, induce a wide sense of permanent intrusion on privacy and intimacy, affect citizens' and institutions' behaviour in a manner that would probably be in conflict with the preservation of the EU's core principles in the field of civil liberties, and that it would not be possible, in the short term, to prevent errors based on flaws in the way differences of age, gender or ethnicity are analysed by the software; thus demands that the Commission, in its upcoming legislative proposal, proposes a ban on deployment and use, in open public space, of facial recognition technologies as long as all of these risks are not duly and comprehensively addressed and overcome.
